


SWINE PAVILION



Above is the current project that entails renovating the Swine Pavilion to its original construction by incorporating modern techniques to ensure the structure will serve future generations


MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Fair Board is to manage, promote and enhance the utilization of the Fairgrounds and the Muscatine County Fair



Muscatine County Fairgrounds




Restoration Project Information



**Connecting our Past
with Your Future**

The Muscatine County Fair Board is working to rehabilitate the entire Fairgrounds. The Fairgrounds have been deemed eligible for listing on the National Registry of Historic Places and we are working to preserve these valuable structures for future generations.



The Fair has over 175 years of history and is an extremely valuable part of the area culture. Muscatine County is unique because we have more historical buildings than typical county fairs in Iowa. The buildings have mostly maintained their original architecture, and we are working to provide much needed improvements so they can stand for another 100 years.

Kent Feeds Corporation has generously committed \$360,000 in support over the next 5 years to help with the project. The gift requires a match and we hope you will consider helping us meet that goal.

*Structures that are 50 years of age and older are eligible for listing on the National Registry of Historic Places, we are confirming the ages of all structures on the fairgrounds

**Newer structures are any structures built after 1965

The Community Foundation of Greater Muscatine is managing the funding for this project. All donations go directly to this group and they send receipts, track spend, and assure compliance with all federal and state regulations.

The project plan is split into two phases. The first phase will focus on the Swine Pavilion, and the second phase will include a detailed project plan and timeline for repairs and rehab of the remaining buildings.

In addition we kicked off an 18 month nomination project in late August of 2014 to get the fairgrounds listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. The nomination will be submitted April 1, 2015 and the fairgrounds should be listed by January 2016.

This complex project will impact many generations for years to come. The Fair Board and Committee have put in countless hours on this project and are planning many more to see it through. Thank you in advance for your generous support.

Below is an example of a proposed plaza where donors will be recognized with their name/business engraved on a wall or brick that will be located within the fairgrounds



Donor Amounts:

\$500-\$2,499 = brick engraved with name

\$2,500-\$4,999 = larger brick engraved with name and personal message

\$5,000-\$9,999 = planted tree with an engraved brick or plaque under it

\$10,000-\$24,999 = naming rights for small projects

\$25,000-\$49,999 = naming rights for medium projects

\$50,000-\$99,999 = naming rights for large projects

\$100,000 and up = naming rights for one of the 3 remaining key buildings
